To students in Fuzoku Junior High School

My name is Ono Yana. I am 41. I am from <u>Ukraine</u>. I was in Ukraine in <u>peacetime</u> from 1989 to 2003. Later I moved to Japan.

But I remember classes held in peacetime at school on <u>primary military</u> training, <u>not only</u> for boys <u>but also</u> for girls. Such classes were made to teach children basic <u>knowledge in case of</u> war. For example, I remember my teacher saying that in case of <u>bombing</u>, we had to run to the <u>subway</u>. But our school was far away from the subway. I thought it was <u>impossible</u>. Everyone was laughing. We were not <u>serious</u>. We did not think that a war would happen in Ukraine. I thought that <u>even if</u> war starts, children will not be killed because they are <u>innocent</u> and they have not done bad things.

But recently, reality in Ukraine showed different things. In 2022, on February 24th, my relatives told me that a war started in Ukraine. I could not believe it. I was shocked very much. I started calling my relatives and my friends in Ukraine. I begged them to leave Ukraine. I worried about them and my house. The first month of the war I was in a very strong shock. I could not sleep. One day, when I was watching TV, I saw people running to the subway. They had to be in the subway for a long time. That reminded me of the lessens taken at school.

I thought that peacetime is just between two wars. I also thought that every <u>nation</u> needs to always be prepared to <u>defend</u> themselves in case of war. The war made me and many Ukrainians realize that we have to be <u>thankful for</u> peacetime and enjoy our lives. Before the war, we <u>took it for granted</u> and we did not <u>appreciate</u> it. But now I realized. Later, I heard that half of my hometown was destroyed.

Usual people like us cannot change world events and <u>politics</u> and unfortunately we cannot stop the war. But we can talk more about the <u>importance</u> of peace, teach our children to live in peace with each other and neighbors and learn how to respect other people's lives. And the most important thing is to learn to think <u>individually</u> and <u>assess</u> the situation <u>independently</u>, and to learn <u>not to</u> be <u>influenced</u> too much by other people's opinions because they are not always right. Also, a new war might begin <u>somewhere</u> else. We really need basic knowledge on how to <u>protect</u> ourselves in case of war.
